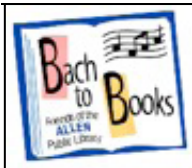
Mmmmmmm – *Chocolate Friendly!*

Bach to Books joins with Collin College to present a series of Monday night programs on trends in the business side of the music industry. This series will provide legal, marketing, and technical considerations for recording and distributing music. It is free and no reservations are needed.

At **7 PM September 13**, Susan Hanlon and the Friday Afternoon Collin Recording Ensemble present their music and discuss the *Benefits and Challenges of Studio Musicians*.

Christopher Davis discusses *Develop your Web Presence* at **7 PM, September 20**. Christopher maintains and writes for the blog *The Classical Guitar*.

The members of **755** will cover *Issues with Live Electronic Music* as well as present live music, **7 PM, September 27**. **755** is a music collective centered around Russ Callison & David Siu.

Spain and the United States' Independence

Dr. Thomas Chávez, author of *Spain and the Independence of the United States: An Intrinsic Gift*, will discuss Spain's important contributions to the thirteen colonies and the American Revolution at **7 PM, Tuesday, September, 21**. Recently retired as the director of the National Hispanic Cultural Center of New Mexico, Dr. Chávez was also director of the prestigious Palace of the Governors Museum in Santa Fe, New Mexico, for over 20 years. Guests can attend any portion or remain for the entire event. Best accompanist will be the final competition of the day.

At 4 PM, Texas Lace will perform a medley of fiddle favorites. Texas Lace has appeared on radio with Red Steagall and the Red Steagall Cowboy Gathering Fiddle Contest at the Fort Worth Stockyards. The Kildares, a Celtic Rock group, will then wrap up the day with fiddle favorites at 7 PM.

Dreams of Flight: A Journey through Air and Space

Haley Curry, Marketing Manager for The Women's Museum in Dallas, will discuss their current exhibit, *Dreams of Flight: A Journey through Air and Space*, **7 PM, Thursday, October 7**. Sponsored by ALLEN Reads, this program is free and no reservations are required.

Ms. Curry will present exhibit highlights, including the women who have served in air and space as pilots, astronauts, astrophysicists and scientists. The 25 women featured in this exhibit demonstrated remarkable courage and tenacity in the face of opposition. This exhibition highlights the women, from the earliest pioneers of flight including Amelia Earhart, Bessie Coleman and Jaqueline Cochran, to science and space innovators such as Barbara Askins, Patricia Cowings and Jerrie Cobb.

Ms. Curry will discuss the first women in America to fly planes and perform acrobatics, "fly girls" of World War II who served as pilots, women who attempted to train for Mercury 13 and women who are in commercial careers as pilots and support roles as engineers and scientists.

Dreams of Flight: A Journey through Air and Space is featured at The Women's Museum, 3800 Parry Avenue, Dallas, TX 75226, (214) 915-0860 until October 31, 2010. Please note that exhibit is open during the State Fair of Texas, Sept. 24-Oct. 17.

Now celebrating her fifth year at The Women's Museum, Haley manages overall marketing strategies and initiatives for the Museum.

This is ALLEN Reads' inaugural program and *Rocket Boys/October Sky* by Homer Hickam is this year's selection. Mr. Hickam will speak at the Allen Public Library on March 12. Watch for details!

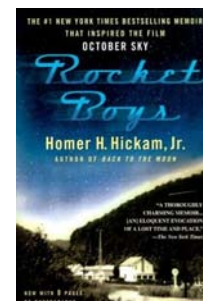
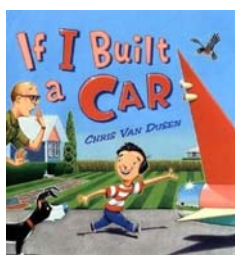
The main book choice for ALLEN Reads 2010-11 is *Rocket Boys*, aka *October Sky*, by Homer Hickam. You probably remember the movie (which will be one of our selections during ALLEN Reads movie month in January). It's a great story with wonderful themes about family, persistence, creativity, and imagination. This autobiographical novel is told with love & humor and is a delight to read.

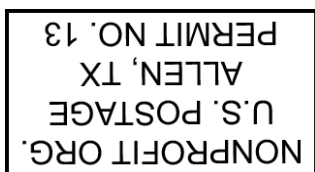
Our book choice for grades 4-8 (though *Rocket Boys* can be read by/read to these ages as well) is *T-Minus: The Race to the Moon* by Jim Ottaviani, Zander Cannon, & Kevin Cannon. It's a graphic novel telling about the same exciting time period as *Rocket Boys* – a non-fiction account of the people behind the scenes in the space race.

For preschool – 3rd grade we have chosen *If I Built a Car* by Chris Van Dusen. In Dr. Seuss type rhyme and with eye-popping illustrations, we go on a journey into Jack's imagination as he designs the car of his dreams. Fun for all ages, right from the author/illustrator's dedication where he thanks his parents for "changing his crayons every 3,000 miles."

You can start reading now or come on October 7 to get started. BORDERS will be at the library with books for you to buy and there will be lots happening. Starting at 5:30 PM, join the Chocolate Friendly, with a light dinner and lots of chocolate to enjoy. There are always great door prizes, too. Then at 7 PM, we'll kick off the new season of ALLEN Reads with Haley Curry from the Women's Museum, who will speak about their current exhibit, "Dreams of Flight: A Journey through Air and Space" (see details in previous column).
